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### Duties

The On-Campus Teacher prepares and teaches targeted technology lessons to small groups and individual students. Prepares lessons in a year's course of study in accordance with amount of instruction based on campus need and other needs as determined through collaboration with the Director of the Education Resource Center and other members of the Assistive Technology Center.

Collaborates with other professionals and support staff to increase the use of and integration of technology on campus including attending and participating in appropriate meetings. Acts as lead teacher for the Teaching Assistant supporting the Assistive Technology Center including schedule coordination, and training as appropriate.

Write curricula, how-to guides, and develop other products to support the acquisition of technology skills as well as the implementation of technology teaching and best practices by members of educational teams.

Assists in short courses and on-campus and community wide events such as White Cane Day, Vendor Day, Assistive Technology Center Open House, etc.

Conference attendance and presentations in the state as appropriate.

### Required Qualifications

- Applicant must possess at least one of the following valid credentials:
  - o California Education Specialist's Credential in Visual Impairment
  - o California Clinical Rehabilitative Services Credential in O&M
- Experience working with students with visual impairments including students with multiple disabilities.
- Knowledge in using and teaching technology and assistive technology.

### Desired Qualifications

- Specialized skills in blindness related assistive technology and extensive knowledge teaching technology to students with visual impairments, including students with additional disabilities.
- Knowledge of specialized curriculum for students with visual impairments, including students with additional disabilities
- Knowledge of the California Common Core State Standards – must be able to scaffold goals to level of student and write goals to meet the needs of students who are VI and have multiple disabilities

- Must have an understanding of the ECC and have experience implementing curriculum with a variety of students and age-ranges
- Experience writing IEP/ITP goals and implementing them
- Extensive knowledge of Braille and experience teaching Braille to VI students who have multiple disabilities
- Knowledge of Functional Vision Assessments, Learning Media Assessments, and Low Vision assessments– experience in assessing and writing / implementing goals from results preferred.
- Excellent interpersonal skills, written communication skills, and oral communication skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively within the assessment team and Education Resource Center as well as with a wide range of stakeholders.
- Proactive self-starter with the ability to multi-task, establish and rearrange priorities, and maintain focus on both short-term and long-term goals.
- Savvy internet skills in researching and discovering deliverables and resources
- Master's Degree or higher
